Carrie Yvonne Wilson was born July 16, 1968 in Oklahoma City, OK. to Austin Wilson, Jr. and Carol Roland Great Wilson. She was the seventh of seven children. Both parents preceded her in death.

She attended Dewey Elementary, Classen High and graduated from S.A.G.E High School.

Shortly, after high school Carrie had her first son, Ty'Juan and later she gave birth to her second son, Londell.

In her formative years, Carrie was a member of St. Luke Baptist Church where her late uncle, Dr. Dewitt Roland, Sr. was pastor. During her young adult years she became a member of Greater Love Missionary Baptist serving under Pastor Gregory Benjamin. She later joined Divine Wisdom Worship Center. It was during the leadership of Pastor Theodis and Minister Sister Felicia Manning that Carrie began to show signs of a transformed life in Christ. The Lord changed Carrie's life—she was definitely growing, she was all-in, and later ultimately received a license to preach the Gospel.

Many people were moved to tears upon hearing Carrie's testimony of how the Lord had delivered her from drugs and her ungodly lifestyle. Moreover, her life was radically transformed after attending a T. D. Jakes "Woman Thou Art

weekend in Dallas, Texas. She couldn't wait to get back home to tell her mother about what the Lord had done in her life. Her testimony continued to touch many. Carrie also showed herself to be a missionary as she touched people whether through a word of encouragement, her smile, giving away clothes, shoes, and furniture or whatever others needed. She believed in helping people.

Carrie had a passion to serve the Lord and she did so with gladness. While a member of Divine Wisdom she served her church and community as a choir member, through Kids Café, Another Chance Ministry, Usher Board, Youth Leader, and Bereavement ministries. She also loved attending the annual Women's Encounter Weekend and Bible study group on Wednesday evenings at Divine Wisdom.

Carrie desired to take ministry to the next level so, she attended Southwestern Christian University. Although the road was long and rough, as she began to become ill, she hung in there as long as she could. Carrie was determined to receive a degree in ministry studies until illnesses began to take their toll on her. Although she only lacked one semester before she would receive a degree, Carrie was unable to complete her studies due to various health challenges.

Besides her church work, Carrie had many jobs in the field of child care and health care. She worked as a child care provider in her own daycare called Carrie's Care-A-Lot Day Care. Carrie also proudly and lovingly worked for Excell Homecare and Hospice, Inc. until her own health began to decline.

On her 50th birthday, Carrie received word of another illness. Over the course of a year and a half she had one diagnosis after another. The final ones eventually kept her in pain and bedridden. Carrie's body had taken all it could.

So, Monday, February 10, 2020 God, our Father, called His daughter home from labor to reward.

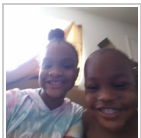
